PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

In 2005, Dominican and Canadian educators met for the first time as participants in teacher training workshops. The Canadians were the trainers, and the Dominicans were the enthusiastic learners whose determination to bring renewal to their schools was expressed in a powerful phrase: "We will be Agents of Change".

In 2008 the first Dominican mentor team was formed, and mentors have been true to their vow. Today, three teams at four sites throughout the country have assumed the role that in early days was held by Canadians. Dominican trainers lead the workshops, and their members hold positions of leadership in their schools and school districts. A visit to their schools and classrooms shows clear evidence of Agents of Change at work.

From the outset, the Dominican mentors challenged TMA to provide what they needed, not just what we wanted to offer. They knew their own strengths: a good curriculum, demonstrated commitment, passion for their work and a desire to learn how to be the best they could be. Good quality training is what was needed, delivered in a way that was culturally sensitive and relevant. In the next chapter of Teacher Mentors Abroad, the Dominican mentor teams will deliver effective training thus acting as catalysts for program expansion. They will thus honour their mandate for change.

Our Program Committee has responded admirably to the challenges of their committee's role. They have brought to the mentor teams the lessons of their teaching experience, the resources they have found to promote growth and, most of all, a desire to support the development of their Dominican colleagues.

The new chapter for TMA also includes new partners that broaden our presence in the Dominican Republic. TMA has signed an Alliance Agreement with the Instituto Superior de Estudios Educativo Pedro Poveda (ISESP) and the Centro Cultural Poveda, two Dominican organizations with a mandate for teacher training and education research. We will now undertake developing specific activity agreements that deliver programs and educational exchanges with our mentor teams. TMA has recently added Board members based in the Dominican Republic. They will serve us well in promoting dialogue with these organizations.

The Program Committee has been the greatest contributor in bringing this growth to fruition. The Board of Directors and Communications Committee added their expertise and support to achieve these goals.

TMA is comprised of genuinely collaborative and committed individuals. Our special thanks and heartfelt gratitude to Doug Wilson, who retires from the Board after years of trusted and invaluable service. To our team members, volunteers, staff, and donors, 'mil gracias', a thousand thank you's. None of this would have been possible without you!


